## Harford on short list for a new state prison

This week 50 years ago, state prison officials revealed seven locations in Harford County being considered for a future medium security prison. The proposed facility would accommodate 1,000 inmates and employ 200 to 300 persons.

Officials seemed most interested in two sites, each located in either the First or the Fifth District. All Harford County sites in the running were within 10 to 15 miles of Bel Air.

The General Assembly was expected to ask for \$10 million in capital funds to construct the facility during its upcoming 1961 session in Annapolis.

On this date in 1960, the Bel Air Town Commissioners made significant decisions at their next to last meeting before the May 2 elections.

They agreed to make Broadway east of Hickory Avenue a one-way street heading east and Webster Street one-way heading east after construction on Webster Street reached completion.

Mr. J. Glasgow Archer was appointed to another five-year term with the Bel Air Planning Commission.

Fifty years ago, the purchase of six acres on Moore's Mill Road near Route 1 was announced by Mr. Pershing Volkart, President of the Board of Trustees of the Harford Day School. The site was once the summer home of renown Baltimore surgeon, Dr. John T. Finney.

Volkart announced the school's intent to turn the property into playing fields for the Harford Day School.

In other news this week 50 years ago, a fire destroyed a two-level shed on the Earl Carroll farm near Chapel Road. Level and Susquehanna Hose companies responded to the call.

The fire caused \$4,000 in damage. A baler, an elevator, 700 bushels of oats, two

wagons and two tractors were among the shed's contents.

A \$789,463 contract was awarded to Henry C. Eastburn and Son, of Newark, Del., for the grading and drainage of a relocated stretch of Route 23.

The work, which included paving, was to be conducted on a length of roadway connecting Route 23 to Maryland Route 165 near Jarrettsville.

This week 50 years ago, The Aegis announced that work to dismantle the Ma & Pa Railroad bridge across Route 24 and Deer Creek at Rocks State Park had begun.

The structure was acquired at no cost in 1959 by the Harford County Highways Department.

It was subsequently sold to the Hellman Paving Company for \$600 in March 1960.

Two-hundred-and-eighty-nine students at Bel Air High School were named to the Honor Roll and Distinguished Scholarship lists this week in 1960.

The Bel Air Bobcats' baseball team won their first three games of the season in 1960. They secured a victory over Westminster with a score of 8-3. The following afternoon, they beat Annapolis 7-4.

In their third game against visiting Towson Catholic, they swept their opponent with a whopping 23-0 score.

Meanwhile, Bel Air's track team tallied eight first-place finishes in their opening meet this week 50 years ago, leaving North Carroll in the dust.

In 1960, Bel Air Drive-In Theater presented showings of "China Doll," "The Invisible Invaders," "The Big Circus," "The Bat," starring Vincent Price, "The Angry Hills," and "Web of Evidence."

Playing at Bel Air Theater were "Guns of the Timberland," "The Last Voyage," "Cash McCall," and "Angry Red Planet."
