# Missing safe tracked down by fox hunter

A stolen safe, reported missing five weeks earlier, was discovered in a wooded area near Cardiff this week 50 years ago.

The three-foot tall, 300-pound safe containing \$632.25 in cash and a number of valuable papers was reported stolen from a Southern States operation in Whiteford on Aug. 26, 1960.

A fox hunter, George Roberts, of Whiteford, discovered the safe at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 1, 1960.

Members of the Bel Air Retail Merchants' Association met on Monday for a luncheon meeting.

They discussed the failure of the Bel Air Commissioners to approve a petition signed by 40 merchants requesting that certain one-way streets be changed to two-way.

Twenty-seven merchants went on record as being strongly in favor of the requested street changes.

The Community Aid-Lift Parade was held in Bel Air on Sunday afternoon to generate support for the 1960 Community Chest-Red Cross United Appeal.

The expected speaker, General William C. Purnell, failed to reach the Bel Air Elementary School grounds on time because his earlier engagement in Dundalk ran late. By the time he arrived by helicopter, the crowds had dispersed.

Still, the parade drew a large crowd. A large number of cars, pieces of fire-fighting equipment, military units, marching bands, scouts, service clubs and other organizations participated in the parade.

A former Harford County man died in North Carolina this week in 1960 as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident. The victim was a former Forest Hill resident and graduate of Bel Air High School.



Harford County was in the midst of a health scare this week 50 years ago.

A virus infection of the upper respiratory system that shares some symptoms with polio appeared in several patients in Harford and York counties.

At press time, physicians had announced that the unnamed infection raised no immediate alarm, but they urged residents to update their polio vaccinations and to visit their physicians if their conditions worsened.

In other news, a Baltimore woman was robbed of her money, jewelry and clothing, and was forced to walk barefoot through a wooded area near Joppa to call for help.

Her watch, an engagement ring, a pocketbook, her wallet containing \$21.50, and her skirt and shoes were taken.

The suspect picked her up in an East Baltimore Street tavern, drove her to another tavern, and then to the secluded area where the crime was committed.

In sports action, the Bel Air Bobcats defeated the Westminster Owls in this week's football contest, with a score of 2-0. A first quarter safety provided the game's only points. The Havre de Grace Warriors suffered their third straight defeat when they lost to Caesar Rodney High School, 9-7, and the Edgewood Rams fell to West Nottingham Academy, 6-0.
